In the winter of 2002, the Pingree School Board of Trustees voted to endorse the Head of School's proposal to create Prep@Pingree. The motivation behind the School's implementation of Prep@Pingree was twofold:

- · To invest Pingree School's resources for the benefit of nearby communities
- · To improve Pingree School's outreach and add greater diversity to the student enrollment

As our third consecutive summer program approaches, the signs of progress are evident:

- Two Prep@Pingree alumni are enrolled in the ninth grade at Pingree on full scholarships
- · All Prep@Pingree alumni are enrolled at various other independent, parochial, and public high schools
- · Prep@Pingree is considering expanding its enrollment to include additional students from Lawrence, Lynn, and Salem

In short, Prep@Pingree makes a positive difference in the lives of its students and staff while at the same time helps Pingree School evolve into a more inclusive, relevant institution.

There are several life changing experiences in one's life and they're either positive or negative. Prep@Pingree was both a positive and life-changing experience. In the academic part of my day, I learned how to take notes. Then in the afternoon, we would have activities time where we played games, learned important school skills, and even watched a movie. The Prep@Pingree experience not only helped my SSAT skills but also helped me prepare for eighth grade and for high school applications.

In math class I learned a plethora of things that I wouldn't have even learned until my eighth grade year. We were introduced to algebra and geometry. These subjects were very easy to learn because the teacher showed passion in what he did. He would help each and every person and would crack jokes in the middle of class. The teacher would also teach us very important note taking skills that helped me acquire outstanding grades in my regular class. I could never find a dull moment in that math class.

English class was a class that I definitely did not look forward to at first. That was until my first day with our teacher. He showed that he had his heart in his work. In English, I learned how to present in front of a class, which I found hard at first. He taught me techniques on how to significantly improve my performance. We also read several short stories and learned how to find the main points of the stories. This concept helped in the English part of the SSAT and in my own writing of book reports. We finally learned how to write exceptional essays that I never knew I could write.

The afternoon activities time was my favorite one because I loved playing the games. In these activities we would learn skills on how to trust others during our games and some were just plain fun. This was the time when I could hang with the rest of my friends and just relax.

Prep @ Pingree was a very useful and life-changing experience for me and it wasn't just for the SSAT's but for academic and personal skills. The classes helped me academically, teaching me to take notes and to write Grade-A essays. The activities helped me in life skills and I became very social. Prep@Pingree is definitely an experience that I would love to go through again for one last time.
